One of the most influential bankers of the 1970s, Citibank's Chairman Walter Wriston, famously declared, "Countries never go bankrupt". During the Eighties, Citibank suffered from many sovereign defaults in Latin America, but Wriston never changed his idea. Why? It is certainly true that sovereign entities are substantially different from companies or banks. Therefore, sovereign specialists need a specific methodology and an accurate set of analytical tools. This training course is designed for professionals seeking to build and enhance their skills in analyzing sovereign and sub-sovereign counterparts and identifying major early warning indicators of financial crises. Participants to the course will be introduced to SACE's technical approach to sovereign and sub-sovereign risk evaluation with a number of examples drawn from its own experience.
